The Southern Regional 4-H Horse Championships in Perry, GA brings youth from 13 states together to compete against each other in educational and horse show outlets. The Tennessee 4-H Horse Program can send up to 70 horse/rider pairs to compete at the event.

- Junior, Junior High, and Senior level youth can attend, but there are no age specific classes. All youth compete against each other.
- A current, negative Coggins MUST accompany the entry form.
- A check for the full amount of entry fees MUST be provided at the time of entry packet submission.
- The University of Georgia (UGA) 4-H Program is hosting the Southern Regional contest this year. The
 accompanied release forms are required by UGA and must be signed in ink. No digital signatures can be
 accepted.
- Refunds cannot be issued after July 8, 2022.

4-H Behavior Agreement for Youth:

The 4-H Code of Conduct Outlined below in in effect for all youth activities involving the Southern Regional 4-H Horse Championships, University of Georgia Cooperative Extension Service, and the 4-H Youth Development Program. It applies to all participants in 4-H activities, with participants defined as 4-H members of any age or grade, all other registered youth and adults, and all other individuals who take part in and/or attend 4-H events.

Violations of this Behavior Agreement will result in disciplinary action based on county or state guidelines. Participants who fail to adhere to the 4-H Code of Conduct may be subject to a range of disciplinary actions. Immediate corrective action will be taken to ensure the safety and welfare of all participants at the event. Additional disciplinary action may be taken upon further investigation of the infraction or incident.

If an individual continually disrupts the group, they will be given an opportunity to discuss the problem with the event chaperones before more drastic action is taken. If, after discussion, the behavior continues or, in the opinion of the chaperones, it would be detrimental for the individual to continue with the group, the participants will be sent home at the participant's/parent's expense. Participants engaging in illegal behavior or behavior that threatens the health, safety, or welfare of others may be asked to leave the event immediately. Participants/Parents will be financially responsible for any damage caused by the participant.

CONSEQUENCES OF MISBEHAVIOR

4-H'ers and adults who observe a breach in the Code of Conduct must report the misbehavior to the appropriate leader. The leader will complete an incident report and determine the next steps regarding the incident.

If 4-H'ers are found participating in actions listed below, during 4-H events, law enforcement or other legal authorities may be notified and may lead the review and consequences related to the incident. In these incidents, 4-H'ers may be removed from the event and suspended or expelled from future 4-H participation. These behaviors may include, but are not restricted to:

- Possession or use of illegal drugs
- Possession or use of a weapon
- Assault or harassment
- Inappropriate sexual behavior

4-H'ers who participate in these actions outside of the program may also be removed, suspended, or expelled from future 4-H participation.

If the 4-H'er is found participating in the actions listed below, 4-H leaders may be notified and may lead the review and consequences related to the behavior. 4-H'ers misbehaving will have the opportunity to explain their actions to leaders in charge of the activity and may request a review board. The person coordinating the event may also convene a review board for the purposes of determining what has occurred and what disciplinary action should be taken. A review board will consist of one Extension faculty or staff member, two volunteers and three 4-H members. The Extension faculty member coordinating the event will serve as chairperson. In some cases, incidents are deemed serious and may be referred to law enforcement or other legal authorities.

If the 4-H'er receives consequences from the leader or through the review process, his/her parents/guardians may be notified; the 4-H'er may be sent home at the parents' expense and may be suspended from participation in 4-H events. Suspensions may be up to one year. If a 4-H'er wishes to appeal the decision of the review board, the 4-H'er must appeal in writing through the County Extension office. Appeals must be filed within 10 days of notification of the disciplinary action. The appeal is sent to the Program Development Coordinator of the 4-H member and the State 4-H Leader for ruling by the State 4-H Leader. Following any disciplinary review, the person coordinating the activity will provide written notification to the appropriate parties including but not limited to the 4-H'er, his/her parent/guardian and his/ her county Extension faculty member.

- · Breaking curfew or disturbing the peace
- Unexcused absences from the activities or premise of an event
- Unauthorized use of vehicles during the event
- Reckless or inappropriate behavior
- Use of foul or offensive language
- Possession or use of alcohol or tobacco
- Possession or use of e-cigarettes or other vaping devices

- Breach of the 4-H Code of Ethics
- Remaining in the presence of those who are breaking the 4-H Code of Conduct
- Theft, misuse or abuse of public or personal property
- Possession of fireworks
- Distribution, misuse, or abuse of over-the-counter, homeopathic, including supplements and vitamins, or prescription medications
