Counties <u>MUST</u> have entries submitted through the online registration system by **May 15, 2025**. Late entries will be assessed a \$50 per horse late fee.

Counties <u>MUST</u> submit all exhibitor entry fees to Aaron Fisher at the address above by **May 25, 2025**. There will be NO REFUNDS for State entry fees, and late entries will be assessed a \$50 per horse late fee.

Exhibitors are REQUIRED to proof State Entries at the Regional Show. No classes will be added at the Regional Show. Absolutely NO changes will be made to entries upon check-in at the State Show.

REMINDERS AND CHANGES FOR 2025

All riders (including adults) at 4-H events and activities will be required to wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI-certified helmets with chin straps properly fastened while mounted or while in a vehicle being pulled by equine. This includes ALL divisions, ALL warm-up arenas, and ALL areas of the showgrounds. For riders over 18 years of age, a helmet waiver may be signed at the show office.

The 2025 Tennessee 4-H Horse Championships will follow rules and guidelines outlined in PB 1760, The Tennessee 4-H Horse Championships Handbook. The handbook can be accessed at: https://utia.tennessee.edu/publications/wp-content/uploads/sites/269/2023/10/PB1760.pdf

Important Reminder from Section 5.7 of Horse Handbook (page 6)

A 4-H member may be excused from his/her regional show and still participate in the Tennessee State 4-H Horse Championships if:

- A. A letter, signed by both the 4-H member and his/her respective Extension agent, is written stating the reason for the 4-H member's desire to be absent from the regional show.
- B. B. This letter is submitted to and approved by the 4-H Animal Science OR Equine Specialist in Knoxville.
- C. The 4-H member, family, leader or Extension agent completes a state entry form along with an entry fee.

The following section summarizes changes and additions for the 2025 show.

Companion Horse Entry Form

- It is becoming more common for families to want to bring a horse that is not entered into the show as a companion animal or a young animal that has never left the barn and they are intending to start to acclimate it to travel. We have found that these horses are not always getting entered, so we don't have a record of them and have missed getting stalls for them. There is a new Companion Horse Entry Form with the typical entry form to ensure that we have a record of them and are able to get stalls assigned appropriately. Please note that these horses must also have a current negative Coggins and are subject to facility and stall fees.
- **Note to County Extension Staff:** Companion horses should be entered into the online Showare system just like horses entered into the show, they just will not have classes assigned to them but will allow you to enter the stall days needed.

Roping Division

- Added Ground/Dummy Roping classes for each age division:
 - o 304: Junior Members
 - o 305: Junior High Members
 - o 306: Senior Members

Roger Elder Ranch Division

• Showmanship and Horsemanship will follow AQHA rules.

Walking/Racking/SSH Divisions

- Change HIO from SHOW to NWHA. The biggest difference with this change will be a few updates to shoeing requirements, class names and elimination of the padded class. Please see the updated handbook for details. This will also provide a larger, more diverse pool of judges.
- Additionally, we updated Rule 6.10. with regards to youth only entering each class once as it related to Gaited Trail.

 6.10.A. There is an exception in Gaited Trail where a member is exhibiting a different horse in more than one of the divisions (Walking, Racking and SSH). These youth may exhibit each horse in their respective Gaited Trail class since it will be different horse/rider combinations.

<u>Dressage</u>

• Dressage classes will follow USEF, WDA and National Walking Horse Association rules. If a situation arises where this rulebook is stricter than USEF, WDA or National Walking Horse Association rules, this rulebook will take precedence.

Open Judging Contest

- Added reasons and/or questions to the Open Horse Judging Contest.
 - Junior: 2 sets of questions
 - o Junior High: 2 sets of questions and 1 set of reasons
 - Senior: 2 sets of questions and 2 sets of reasons

Career Development Contest

• This contest is designed to provide workforce development experience for youth through creating a resume, targeting a cover letter to a specific job and participating in a mock interview. This contest is open to Senior Level 1 (grades 9-10) and Senior Level 2 (grades 11-12) youth. Winners will receive cash prizes from the Developing Champion Youth Endowment. Interviews will be a maximum of 15 minutes and will take place during the week of the state 4-H horse show in Shelbyville (June 24-28). Interview times will be available on multiple days. Youth who enter this contest will be contacted to schedule a time for their interview. ADDITIONAL PROGRAM AND SHOW DETAILS

1. Divisions

The grades for 4-H member age divisions as of January 1, 2025, are as follows:

Junior: 4-5 Junior High: 6-8 Senior: 9-12 *NOTE*: If a Junior High class does not exist, Junior classes will be for 4-8 grades.

2. Pony Heights

All ponies will be measured each year EXCEPT those that were previously measured and were six (6) years of age or older AND have a pony measurement card on file with the State 4-H Horse Show Office. <u>Exhibitors need to indicate if their pony has been measured on their entry form.</u>

3. Graduating Seniors

Graduating seniors will be recognized at the banquet held on Tuesday, June 24, 2025. Indicate Graduating Senior on the exhibitor's entry form or contact fisher@utk.edu if the graduating senior is not showing but would like to attend the banquet for recognition. 4. Tennessee 4-H Horse Scholarship

The purpose of the Tennessee 4-H Horse Scholarship is to award a deserving 4-H Horse participant with a post-secondary education scholarship. The winner will be selected based

upon their participation within the Tennessee 4-H Horse Program, scholastic achievement, and submitted application materials. FACILITY AND SHOW GROUND INFORMATION

- 1. ALL HORSES MUST ENTER THROUGH GATE A FOR HEALTH INSPECTION. Gate A is located on the upper end of Calsonic Arena off of Celebration Drive. Do not bring horses through any other gate. Be sure that original Coggins test results accompany the horse(s) to the show; no copies will be accepted. Horses must have a negative test for EIA within 12 months of the opening date of the show (June 17). These papers will be checked upon arrival at the Show grounds! Please have Coggins Tests for all horses contained in the trailer in the VEHICLE PULLING HORSE TRAILER.
- 2. Please check-in upon arrival at the Horse Show Office, located in Barn 10 adjacent to the practice arena. Stable assignments, exhibitor numbers and other information can be collected at this time. Do not unload and/or stable horses until checked-in at the show office has been completed. Stable assignments will also be available online a week before the show.
- 3. Grounds will be open Tuesday, June 24 at 7:00am. NO HORSES ALLOWED ON GROUNDS BEFORE THIS TIME.
- 4. Exhibitors are responsible for paying for their stalls. Stalls (horse and tack) are \$14 a day. In 2025, stall fees will be \$8 per stall per day due to sponsorship from the Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration. Stall fees must be paid with entry fees. Horses will be permitted to trailer in and be tied out, these horses may NOT be tied out overnight. Tie-out trailers may only park in the lot next to gate A. NO overnight trailers may be parked in this lot! (see map below)

5. All horse trailers staying overnight must be parked in the lot off Whitthorne Street (see map below). Trailers cannot be parked in stable areas or along the drives. ANY TRAILERS NOT PARKED IN DESIGNED AREAS ARE SUBJECTED TO BEING TOWED AT THE OWNER'S EXPENSE. Cooperation in this matter is appreciated.



- 7. The cost for travel trailer parking is \$60.00 per night. Water, sewer and electrical hookups are available. Hook-ups are located in the Pavilion Area parking lot. Payment for camping spots MUST BE MADE AT THE SHOW OFFICE (Barn 10) PRIOR TO THE FIRST NIGHT'S STAY.
- 8. Camping in tents is not permitted.
- 9. Bring all the equipment, feed, and hay that will is needed. Please emphasize this to 4-H members, parents, and leaders.
- 10. **STALLS MAY NEED TO BE CLEANED UPON ARRIVAL.** If shavings are desired, you may bring them with you or purchase them on the grounds at the show office in Barn 10.
- 11. It is the responsibility of each group to keep the stables and the area around the stable clean.
- 12. Bring a manure fork, rakes, wheelbarrow and other equipment needed to clean the stalls and area. Wheelbarrows will be needed to transport manure, trash and other waste to the manure pits.
- 13. Stall(s) must be cleaned daily. Pile manure in pits. Daily cleaning of stalls will help to keep the fly population reduced and maintain a more desirable environment.
- 14. You must completely clean the stalls and area you were assigned before leaving the grounds.
- 15. Cooking is prohibited in the stables.
- 16. Sleeping in stalls is prohibited.
- 17. Bring a hammer, nails and tools that might be needed for stall repair.
- 18. You will need to bring light bulbs for stalls. Bulbs are not provided.
- 19. Fans may be used. However, care should be taken to prevent horses from either reaching or becoming entangled in cords.

- 20. Stalls for horses and tack will be **randomly assigned** based on stall assignment sheets submitted by exhibitors.
- 21. A padlock and chain should be brought to lock the tack stall(s). DO NOT LOCK HORSES WITHIN STALLS.
- 22. A security guard will be on the grounds at night. **Although security is available, please inform 4-H** members, parents and leaders not to leave valuables, purses and similar items in unsecured areas.
- 23. The phone number at the Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration office is (931) 684-5915. Calls can be forwarded from that office to the 4-H Horse Show office in Barn 10.
- **24.** If you are not coming to the show, please designate a leader or parent that will be in charge of the group from your county. This is needed in order that a contact person will be available for messages, to locate someone, etc.
- **25. ALL DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH AND ARE NOT PERMITTED IN ANY INDOOR FACILITY.** If the dog is designated as a service animal, proper documentation, and animal identification must be displayed.
- 26. NO SMOKING IN THE BARNS.
- 27. <u>REMEMBER THAT ALL ENTRIES IN WALKING, RACKING, AND SPOTTED SADDLE HORSE CLASSES MUST PASS INSPECTION WITH THE SHOW DQP PRIOR TO COMPETING.</u> Horses in the first class of each session MUST be in the inspection area AT LEAST 30 MINUTES prior to the start of the class. For all other classes, horses must arrive at the inspection area at least THREE CLASSES prior to their class.

DIRECTIONS TO THE CELEBRATION® GROUNDS AND CALSONIC ARENA

Coming to The Celebration® from Nashville, TN

Take I-24 to Murfreesboro, then take exit 81 A to Shelbyville.

From Murfreesboro to Shelbyville is about 25 minutes. Once in Shelbyville, turn left on Highway 41 A South (Madison Street) and look for the Celebration® on the left.

Coming to The Celebration® from Chattanooga, TN

Take I-24 toward Murfreesboro and exit on Exit 97 to Wartrace/Shelbyville. Following Highway 64 through Wartrace until it intersects with Highway 41 A. Turn right onto Highway 41A (Madison Street) and look for the Celebration® on the right.

Coming to The Celebration® from Knoxville, TN

Take I-40 E toward Nashville, then take exit 235 onto TN-840 W toward Murfreesboro. Exit onto I-24 E

toward Chattanooga. Exit I-24 on exit 81 A to Shelbyville. Once in Shelbyville, turn left on Highway 41A South (Madison Street) and look for the Celebration® on the left.

Coming to The Celebration from Memphis, TN

Take I-40 toward Nashville, then exit onto I-440 at exit 206; at Exit I-24 go toward Murfreesboro; exit I-24 at Exit 81 A onto US-231. From Murfreesboro to Shelbyville is about 25 minutes. Once in Shelbyville, turn left on Highway 41A South (Madison Street) and look for the Celebration® on the left.
